

Key Focts:

- Less than one hundred years ago, most people were born, lived and died within 100 miles.
 Nowadays people can travel all over the world in hours/days. Modern transport has changed the way we live and work.
- Orville and Wilbur Wright were two brothers who sold bicycles and began to experiment with flying machines. Their first aeroplane, the Wright Flyer, successfully flew in front of 5 people in 1903.
- The first steam engines were invented in 1769 by James Watt. They were originally used in factories to help machine work. The first steam train was built in 1804. In the 1800s rail travel changed how people lived.
- In 1886 Carl Benz made the first petrol-powered motor car.
- Significant transport routes/structures in Kent include: The Dartford Crossing, the ports of Dover and Folkestone
- Kent has key transport links to London and across the channel to Europe.
