

LKS2 - Safety

Curriculum Links:

- Recognize hazards in order to keep safe at home (including around electrical appliances) and fire safety (e.g. not playing with matches and lighters). Consider ways to reduce these risks.
- Know that household products (including medicines) can be harmful if not used correctly.
- Recognise the importance of taking medicines correctly and using household products safely, (e.g. following instructions carefully).
- Understand how to predict, assess and manage risk in different situations.
- Discuss strategies for keeping safe in the local environment or unfamiliar places (rail, water, road) and firework safety,.
- Discuss safe use of digital devices when out and about (headphones/phones whilst walking).
- Learn what to do if there is an accident and someone is hurt including first aid.
- Know basic techniques for dealing with common injuries
- Know how to respond and react in an emergency situation; how to identify situations that may require the emergency services and know how to contact them and what to say.
- Understand that female genital mutilation (FGM) is against British law, what to do and whom to tell if they think they or someone they know might be at risk.
- Understand risks posed by strangers and what to do if they are approached.

Emergency	A serious, unexpected, and often dangerous situation requiring immediate action.
Female Genital Mutilation	Procedures that involve partial or total removal of the external female genitalia, or other injury to the female genital organs for non-medical reasons.
First Aid	help given to a sick or injured person until full medical treatment is available .
Hazard	A situation, item or object considered to place a person in danger of significant harm.
Risk	The likelihood that a person may be harmed or suffers adverse health effects if exposed to a hazard.
