

KS1 - Aspiration

Curriculum Links:

- Understand that everyone has different strengths.
- Know that jobs help people to earn money to pay for things.
- Understand that different jobs that people they know or people who work in the community do.
- Know about some of the strengths and interests someone might need to do different jobs.

Learning Points:

- Unpick the stereotypes around different careers—Are all nurses female? Are all doctors men? Etc.
- Learn about different jobs that may be more unusual or unfamiliar to them.
- Discuss the types of job they would like to do and consider the skills they may need to work on to get that job.
