## = Aspiretion Corriculum Links:

- Recognise positive things about themselves and their achievements; set goals to help achieve personal outcomes
- Understand that there is a broad range of different jobs/careers that people can have; that people often have more than one career/type of job during their life
- Understand about stereotypes in the workplace and that a person's career aspirations should not be limited by
- Consider what might influence people's decisions about a job or career (e.g. personal interests and values, family connections to certain trades or businesses, strengths and qualities, ways in which stereotypical assumptions can deter people from aspiring to certain jobs)
- Learn that that some jobs are paid more than others and money is one factor which may influence a person's job or career choice; that people may choose to do voluntary work which is unpaid.
- Understand some of the skills that will help them in their future careers e.g. teamwork, communication, negotiation, digital literacy.
- Identify the kind of job that they might like to do when they are older.
- Recognise a variety of routes into careers (e.g. college, apprenticeship, university).

## Key Learning:

- Understand the process of applying for a job, writing a CV and completing an interview.
- Know where to look for jobs related to a particular field.
- Digital literacy skills such as excel or powerpoint.
