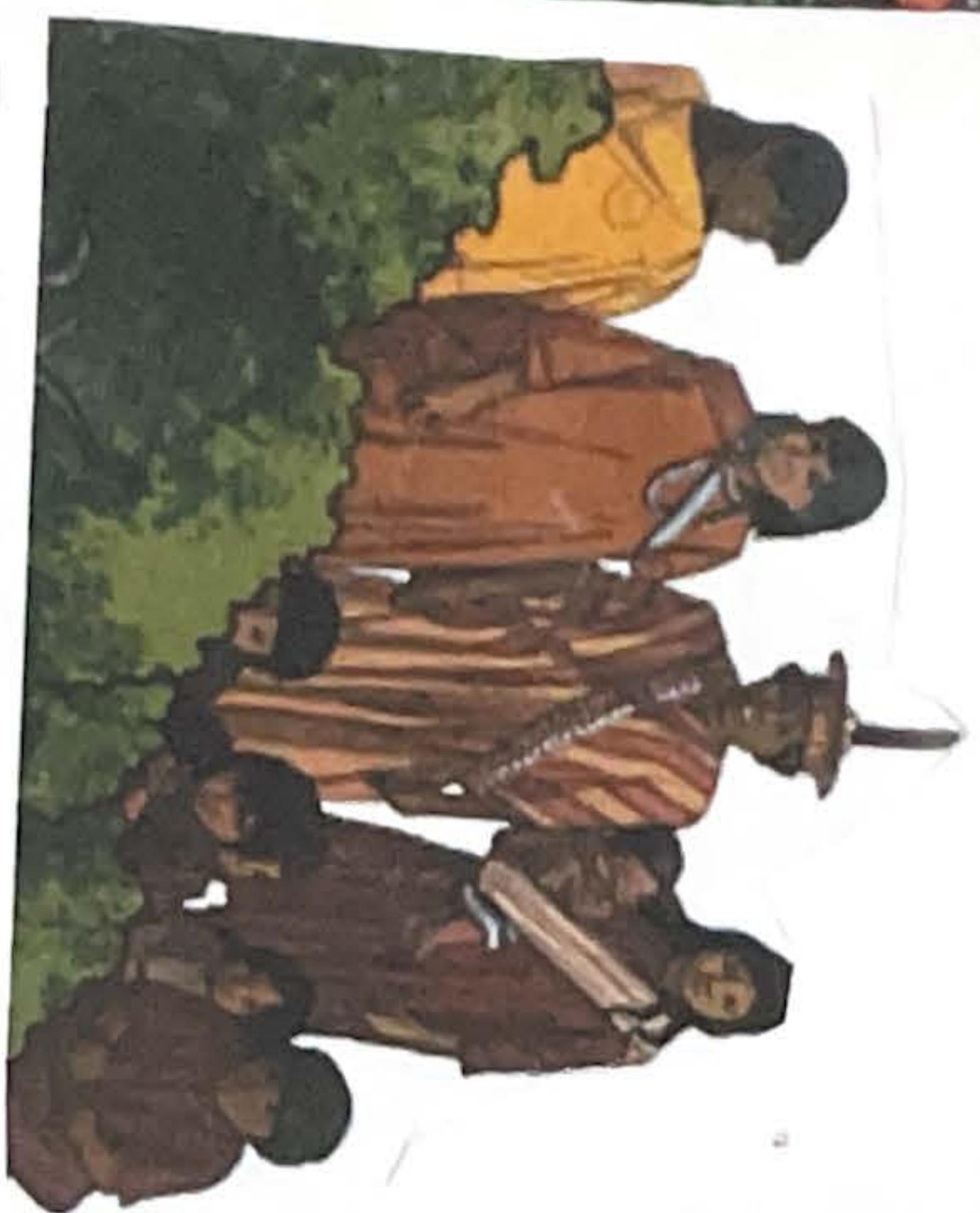

It's home to over 1300 bird and species

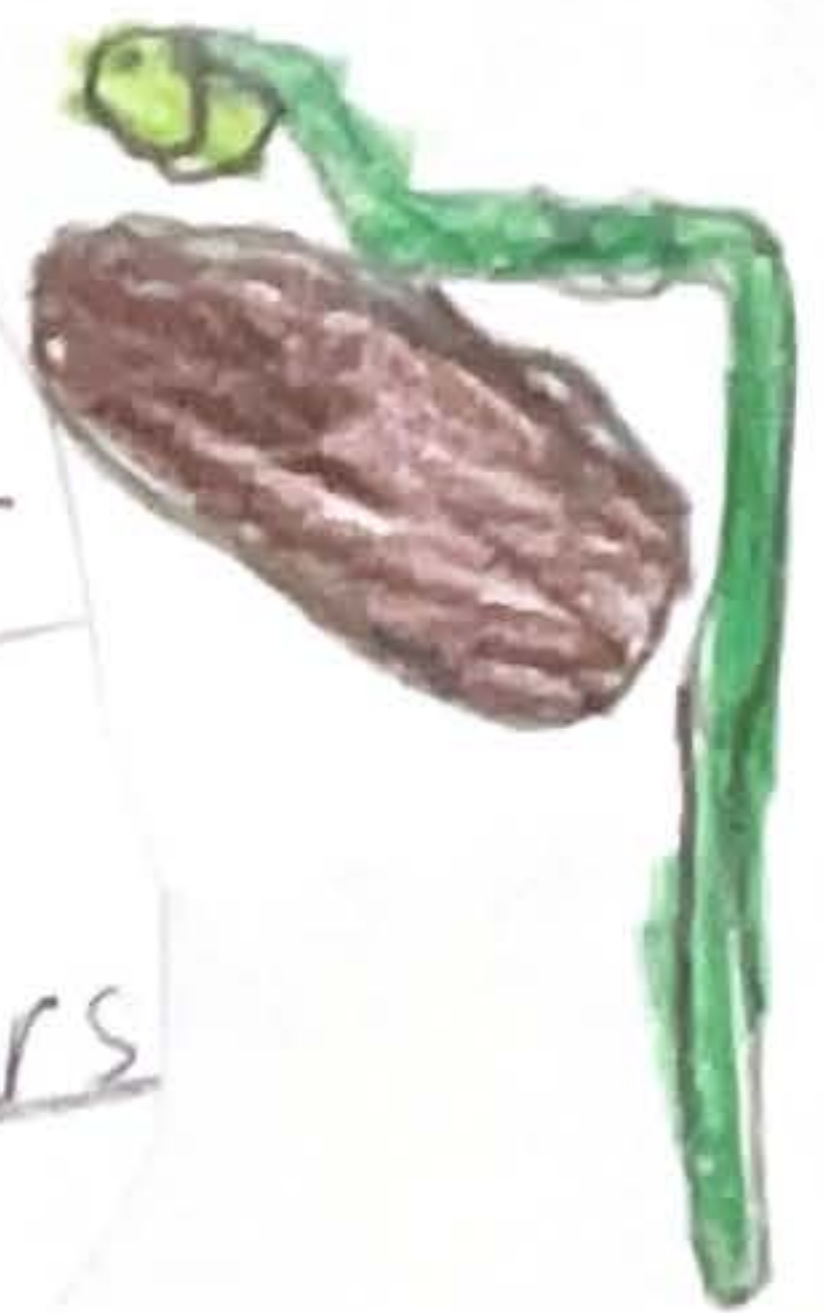
427 mammals 378 reptiles and over 400

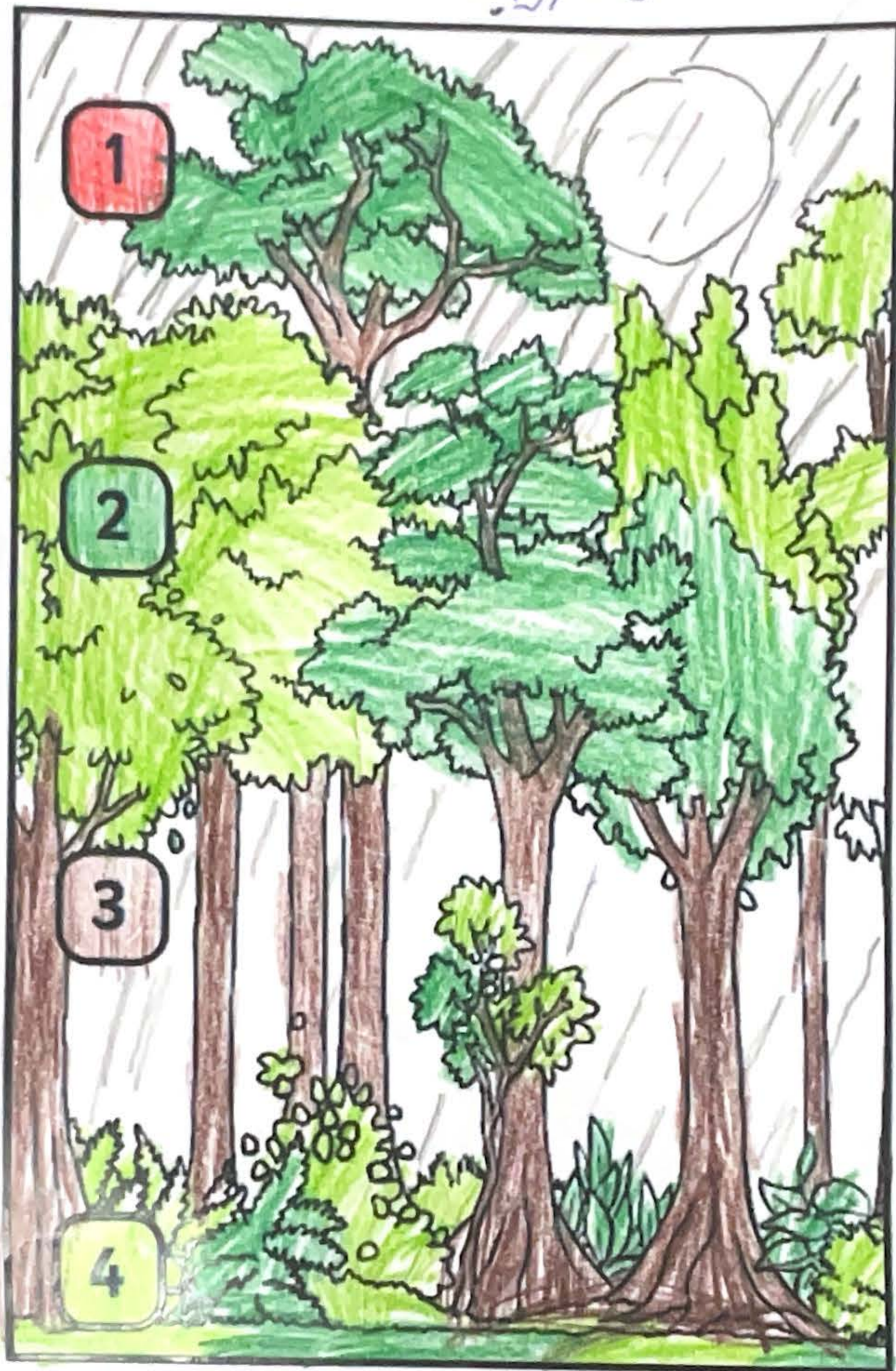
