Early Learning Goals and Key Outcomes:

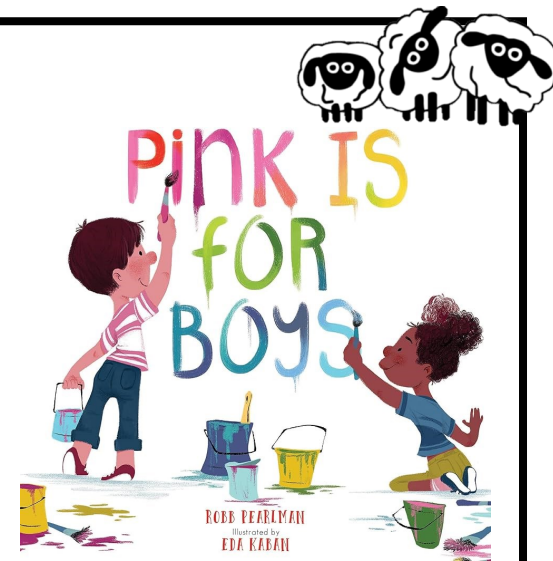
- Develop their own ideas and make strategies which play to their strengths for doing things they want to pursue.
- Take part in pretend play that mimics job roles and career choices.
- Use role play to think beyond here and now, using phrases such as, “when I grow up...”
- Name and describe familiar job roles.
- Understand that a job is a way of people earning money.

Learning Points:

- That anyone can do any job despite age, gender, ethnicity or religion.
- The different jobs that are available and how to get there (work hard at school, be polite and kind etc.).

Possible Experiences:

- Draw people in different job roles to discuss work place stereotypes.
- Have a visit from people in different job roles.
- Role play different job roles and experience different role play costumes (doctor, dentist, police officer, shop keeper, teacher, firefighter, nurse etc.).
- Discuss things they wish to do when they grow up.
- Visit ‘Little Street’.
- Experience handling money/debit cards.
- Create mood boards relating to different colours for boys and girls.
- Opportunities to share things they are good at.
