Key Vocabulary:

Clip	Small parts of a video or pictures that make up one overall video.
Crop	Cutting a part of an image or video away.
Cut	To divide a clip into two separate parts.
Export	Save your video to your computer to use with software or send somewhere else.
Import	To bring video clips into a video editing software from a storage device or camera.
Frame	A single image in a sequence of video frames.
Overlay	Adding additional visuals or effects onto existing footage.
Sequence	A set of related events, movements or items that follow each other in a particular order
Transition	The way one clip transitions to another, such as a fade or dissolve.
Timeline	The timeline is where we place the clips in an order to make a whole video.
Trim	To remove or adjust the beginning or end of a clip.
